## Read up on the latest trends in Europe's drug problem in the European Drug Report 2014

How many new drugs were detected in Europe over the last year? Is cannabis getting stronger? How many Europeans have ever used an illicit drug? What are the latest drug policy developments in the region? These are just some of the questions explored by the EU drugs agency (EMCDDA) in the latest European Drug Report information package.

This annual overview of the European drug situation is delivered as an interlinked range of products, with the *European Drug Report: Trends and developments* at its centre. Accompanying the report are *Perspectives on drugs*, online interactive windows on key aspects of the European drug situation. The *European Drug Report: Data and statistics* and *30 Country overviews* complete the picture, providing explanatory graphics and national-level data.

The drugs we see in Europe today are, in many ways, different from those known in the past. This multilingual package offers easy access to evidence-based information on the drug situation, interventions and policies across the 28 EU Member States, Turkey and Norway. As such, it is an essential resource for informing European policies and responses and enhancing understanding of a drug phenomenon in constant evolution.
