- More than 110 000 students in 2011




ESPAD data collections

- 26 countries in 1995
- 30 countries in 1999
- 35 countries in 2003
- 35 countries in 2007 (plus 5 in 2008)
- 39 countries in 2011
- About 40 countries in 2015?

Some facts about ESPAD

- Owned by the Principal Investigators
- Students that will become 16 years old during the year of the data collection
- Nationally representative samples of classes
- About 2.400 participating students in each country (2011: 366(Liechtenstein) – 6084 Poland))
- More than 110.000 European students in 2011
- Strategy: Standardisation

ESPAD Databases

- Data from 2003, 2007 and 2011 are gathered in three databases
- Open for use by ESPAD researchers as well as external researchers
- A simple application procedure
- Will investigate the possibility also to gather the 1995 and 1999 national datasets in databases

Transition period 1: 2013 - 2014

- Björn has had his ESPAD desk at EMCDDA during 2013 and 2014
- Decision about a new and more detailed constitution (2013)
- Deepened cooperation with EMCDDA
- Preparations for the 2015 data collection
- A new governing of ESPAD from 2015



Transition period 2: 2015 - 2016

- Long term funding uncertain
- Hoped that a the economic situation will be more stable from 2017
- A temporary solution for 2015-2016,
 i.e. the years of data collection and reporting
- Björn will stop being the ESPAD Coordinator by the end of 2014
- The Coordinator responsibilities will be shared between Ludwig Kraus (Deputy Coordinator), Julian Vicente (EMCDDA) and Håkan Leifman (CAN)



Next ESPAD data collection 1(2)

- Next survey in 2015
- Regional seminars with all countries that will take part in the next data collection
- A study in 4 countries of the validity
- A review of the questionnaire. New questions about:
 - Internet, gaming and gambling
 - New psychoactive substances
 - Waterpipe and e-cigarettes



Next ESPAD data collection 2(2)

Strict rules for using computers in 2015

- Proven in nation wide studies that data are comparable between paper-and-pencil and computer modes
- Being sure that all schools in the country have access to enough computers and that computer labs can be organised in such a way that students' privacy is secured

Alternative: A full scale split half study
