The ESPAD Validity Study: Purpose

- The second ESPAD Validity study (Classroom and directly after an interview)
- Goals
 - 1. Study the validity of the ESPAD questionnaire
 - 2. Study the validity of some key variables
 - 3. Test some possible new questions, including the NPS module



Data collection

- Data collected in the autumn of 2013
- Successfully conducted in Iceland, Italy,
 Montenegro and Ukraine
- The Czech Republic had to drop out
- No representative samples

Number of participating students

Iceland 243

Italy 199

Montenegro 266

<u>Ukraine 430</u>

Total 1 138

The NPS module

- 1. New substances that imitate the effects of illicit drugs [such as cannabis or ecstasy] may now be sometimes available. They are sometimes called ['legal highs', 'ethno botanicals', 'research chemicals'] and can come in different forms for example herbal mixtures, powders, crystals or tablets. Have you ever used such substances?
 - Yes, I have used such substances
 - No, I never used such substances
 - Don't know/ Not sure
- 2. Have you used such substances in the LAST 12 MONTHS?
- 3. What was the appearance/form of the new substance you used in the LAST 12 MONTHS?
- 4. Thinking about your use of new substances in the LAST 12 MONTHS, how did you get them?

How did the students understand the initial question of the NPS module?

Interpretation of the interviewers

Understanding about new psychoactive drugs

Understood Misunderstood

correctly

Who did not understand? 1(3)

Iceland: Non-consumers who have never heard of these drugs

Montenegro: Most students who said that they did not understand the question had never heard about these drugs

Who did not understand? 2(3)

Proportion of non-consumers among the students that did not understand the question about new psychoactive drugs: 99%

Who did not understand? 3(3)

Conclusions

- 1. Students who did not understand answered in the student questionnaire that they had not used any of them and the "problem" was that they had not heard about them
- 2. We have to accept that many ESPAD students have never heard of these new drugs and as long as they give the correct answer that they have never used them this is not an important problem
