


Project plan

[1]Policy makers and experts

Those responsible for the formulation of strategies and decision-making in drug policy. They can be Government or Parliament members of officers in drug policy units located in health social police etc. bureaucracies, they can be at state and federal/regional levels of Government in the different jurisdictions. Experts from international organisations active in drug policy are also included here.


[3]Experts in prevention and treatment

Experts in the prevention of drug use and drug-related problems, as well as harm-reduction and treatment, particularly among young people. They are experts from international and national organisations.

[4]Scientist conducting or using school surveys

They can be either scientists responsible for planning and implementing cross-national school surveys on substance use and risk behaviors in their respective countries, or scientists using these data for the production of scientific evidence to inform policy and practice.

Focus groups: methodology

Methodology:

Experts per stakeholder group were selected taking into consideration their geographical distribution

The questions of the survey were validated with the stakeholders through a facilitated interactive online workshop that combines the use of the GroupMap tool with a set of participatory processes.

The focus groups were held on 23 and 24 February

GroupMap (www.groupmap.com) is a decision support tool that can be used in digitally facilitated online workshops and in face to face ones. It allows brainstorming, grouping, voting, prioritisation of ideas through a series of possible maps and processes.

The workshops was moderated by a **facilitator** certified by the International Association of Facilitators (<u>www.iaf-world.org</u>).





The Pompidou Group launched the 2022 Web Survey to assess use of school surveys in policy and prevention planning and evaluation across more than 40 countries in the European and Mediterranean regions.

The ESPAD-MedSPAD web survey aims to improve understanding of how school surveys are being used in policy and prevention planning and evaluation, with a special focus on the ESPAD and MedSPAD surveys (1). These results will be helpful to improve their use in drug policies, prevention strategies and interventions and public debate.

The ESPAD-MedSPAD web survey, which is voluntary and anonymous, will run for six weeks. The main stakeholders invited to participate in the survey are policy makers, policy experts, experts in prevention and harm-reduction and scientists conducting or using school surveys.

The ESPAD-MedSPAD bridge project is funded by the Council of Europe - Pompidou Group, supported by the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA) and carried out under the scientific lead of the Italian National Research Council.

The project is aimed to assess for the first time the current and potential use of school survey data in policy and prevention.
