A minority of gay men uses chemsex but it's a big problem for a small number of people



Chemsex signal

- Substance use is prevalent in many studies on men who have sex with men (MSM) and well known for years
 - Several factors including social norms, homophobia, concomitant depression and anxiety probably contribute to the high rate of substance use in gay men (Mayer et al., Lancet, 2012).
- The SLAM phenomenon is an increasingly popular practice mainly in Paris gay scene, and defined by 3 characteristics:



Study of the signal in France: 4 steps



1. Different objectives and methods

To investigate qualitative and declarative information on the relationship between sex practice and PAS use among SUMSM

 Methods: A self-report anonymous form was administered to SUMSM in addictology department or on a web site publicised by HIV association (AIDES) between October 2013 and July 2014

French Helpline

« Drogues info service » is a free, confidential treatment referral and information service for individuals, entourage and families facing substance use disorders: Analysis of the signal

Methods: Extracting data from the database between January 2014 and december 2015. All calls concerning synthetic cathinones





2. Results: Is there spread of slam phenomenon in France area?




French Helpline drogues info service (2014-15)

The signal has **increased since 2012** in France

Presence of slam signal in Helpline is a sign of spread

The growth of addictovigilance notifications might be due to search of signal (bias)













3. Discussion about Addictovigilance Network report

- Infectious complications in 6%
- Seroconversion may be artificially low
 - HIV and HCV infections can remain asymptomatic for a long period of time
 - HIV-HCV infected people remain undiagnosed
 - We know the time between infection and diagnosis is excessively long
 - It's difficult to know if people are infected before or after chemsex
- The interest of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) in this population
- Question about ART adherence and interaction
- The importance of the dialogue between patient and healthcare providers










3. Discussion: «drug and sex»



- ✓ Prevailing expected sexual effect++
- ✓ **Importance** of PAS on the gay sexuality
 - Experienced as booster of libido, performance increase
 - ✓ Nonsense : obligation of the use of sildenafil-like
- ✓ « Slam »: Substance misuse problem or sexual health problem?
- ✓ Sexual health = not merely the absence of disease (HIV, Viral Hepatitis..) but requires a positive and respectful approach to sexuality and sexual relationship.
- ✓ One of the message for chemsexers could be: Don't forget recreational use but don't forget the ability to enjoy sober sex



(4) Perspective: Study of chemsex harm reduction: impact of product analysis (in progress)

- Variation of composition represents an interesting approach of harm reduction related to the use of NPS
- The true content of the product can be very different from the one indicated on packaging. Providing information about product testing is a tool of harm reduction for drug users.
- Slammers are a specific group of drug users without knowledge about drugs, without knowledge about harm reduction and not in care in addiction structure

OBJECTIVES: Impact of drug analysis as harm reduction for the slammers or chemsexers



CONCLUSION

- French prevalence of the slam data in futur PREVAGAY results
- Slam is the hard part of Chemsex* phenomenon (*wich must be investigated)
- Prevention strategy with (PrEP) pre-exposure prophylaxis/ Hepatitis C
- Marker of drug use: « sildenafil-like treatment » must be known
- Specific Harm reduction for chemsexers?
- Sexuality education
