



Privacy statement on Privileged accounts session recording

Any data collected or information provided by the EMCDDA to the European Institutions and bodies (EUI) will be processed in accordance with 'Regulation (EU) 2018/1725'. This Regulation concerns the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data provided to the European Union institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data. In compliance with Articles 15 and 16 of the Regulation, the EMCDDA provides all the concerned persons with the following information:

The Controller¹ of the data is the Head of the Information and Communication Technology unit.

In order to properly manage the security and compliance of its information systems and infrastructure operations, the EMCDDA has implemented a Privileged Accounts Management system (PAM).

This processing involves data related to the interventions, ICT system administrators and any contractors supporting them, run on the EMCDDA production systems.

This system is intended to increase overall security by providing functionality to manage systems access and the complexity associated to the expiration periods of privileged accounts passwords, in order to respect EMCDDA security policies.

The EMCDDA reserves the right to activate recording on the administrator sessions performed on systems holding sensitive data.

This data must be kept for a maximum of two months and it will only be accessible to the head of unit and to the EMCDDA Security Officer.

Recourse

[1] Article 3(8) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 defines the controller as follows: '[...] controller means the Union institution or body or the directorate-general or any other organisational entity which, alone or jointly with others determines the purpose and means of the processing of personal data [...]'].
